Summary

Population:

Population has increased 44,377 from 2000 to 2005.

Females outnumber males 51.7% to 48.3%.

The largest age group is 25-44 years.

The white population is the majority with 66.8%.

The Hispanic population in this area has increased 35.0% from 2000-2005.

The population is expected to increase 115,460 from 2010-2030.

Labor Force:

The unemployment rate has remained relatively stable, rising slightly from 4.6% in 2002 to 5.4% in 2005.

Educational Attainment:

High school graduates top the list with 27.0%, followed by Bachelors degree or higher with 25.0%.

Industry Employment:

The top two industries in this area are Trade, Transportation and Utilities, and Government.

Occupational Employment:

Top five occupations currently are: retail salespersons, cashiers, waiters and waitresses, laborers and material movers, and combined food prep and servers.

Projected Occupations:

The top five occupations with the most openings in 2002-2012 are: waiters and waitresses, combined food prep and servers, cashiers, retail salespersons, and general/operational managers.

Occupational Wages:

The average wage for the area is \$15.93, with an entry wage of \$7.53 and an experienced wage of \$20.13.

Per Capita Income:

With a PCI of \$29,120 in 2004, this area is ahead of the state's PCI of \$27,185.
